Nearly 37 million people are living with HIV but only around 60% of them know they have the virus. Get up to date with the latest figures.

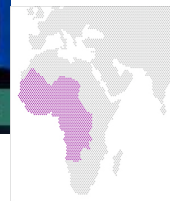

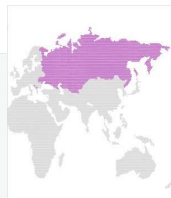

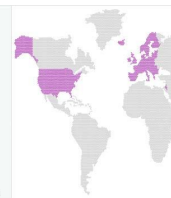
