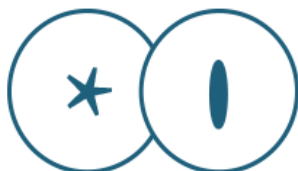
Emergency HIV treatment (PEP) fact sheet
